

To Everyone ...

Without you the Raglan would not be able to survive - you staff the gallery every week and help at openings and events like the Christmas Market, while Board members undertake all the administration, arrange and hang exhibitions, and organise events. It has been a difficult couple of years with Covid swirling through the community - thank you for getting us through it.

The worth of all your work may surprise you. Using Volunteering Australia's calculator based on the average part-time wage plus 15% for employer on-costs such as superannuation, payroll tax and administration as a replacement cost ... and conservatively estimating 55 hours per week for all volunteers' work undertaken at the gallery, plus the additional work Board members do at home, we've arrived at an estimated annual monetary replacement value of \$123,752.00!

It would be even higher if we did not employ Greg Cowell who keeps the gardens looking their best. Greg also recently filled the chasm opening in the driveway at the disability parking area and entrance. Thank you too, Greg.

To all our artists - without your work there is no gallery. For continuing to make inspiring and challenging exhibitions this year and to come in 2023, for the joy, for the many ways of seeing our world ...
