'Let Me Be Mysellf; the Life Story of Anne Frank has been drawing visitors and school groups throughout August. This travelling exhibition documents her life in text and filmed events. Included are an original Star of David fabric badge and facsimilies of Anne's diary. The National Museum of Australia kindly donated a secure vitrine display case to the Raglan for the display of these items and for future exhibitions.

The exhibition also references contemporary instances of discrimination, serving as a powerful reminder that this is not a phenomenon that exists only in history.

Convict Women

One performance only! **Sunday 1 October 5pm** at the Raglan. Entry by Donation.

This critically acclaimed production pays tribute to the contribution made by the 25,000 women who were despatched from England to the colonies in Australia between 1788 and 1850. Their struggles, suffering and perserverance are brought to life with great emotion by writer and performer Jolanta Juszkiewicz and director Anatoly Frusin.

Convict Women received the 2002 Energy Australia National Trust Heritage Conservation Built and Cultural Individual Award acclaimed as 'a wonderful example of bringing heritage to life as an art form'.

Creator and performer Jolanta Juszkiewicz has continously run Kropka Theatre since its inception in Sydney in 1997. Her internationally recognised works and master classes have been presented at major international festivals and in 30 countries across Europe, Scandinavia, South America, the near and Middle East and Australia. Her work has been recognised by the governments of both Poland and Australia.

Jolanta will also be available to speak to audience members after the performance. Seize the opportunity to see this unique production.

In Memoriam

Dugald Mitchell, who passed away on 18 August.



Dugald was a devoted, and much valued, member of the Raglan community. It was only earlier this year that declining health forced him to retire from his monthly Saturday afternoon as an attendant on the gallery desk.

Dugald's enthusiasm for Cooma and promoting it as a tourist destination was unflagging. As well as the Raglan, in recent years he was a most engaged member of the Hydro 1 Heritage Centre project.

We extend our sympathy to Craig and Susie, Joey Herbert, and all the Mitchell families, their friends, and the

members in the many community organisations where Dugald participated over many years.

In July the Raglan had the sad privilege of hosting the memorial for local artist Angela Buckley.

Angela was indefatiguable in her role as curator of the reinvigorated Monaro Art Group, encouraging artists, publicising the gallery on Sharp St and ensuring its presentation always attracted passers by. Tributes at the memorial underlined her depth of community connection, her superb artistic skill, and the deep regard and affection in which she was held.

We extend our sympathy to her partner Dave, children Ned, Ella, Alex and their families, her friends, and to her colleagues at the MAG.
